With restrictions now easing, we thought it would be a good time to remind you that the woods, and the Friends group, are still here.

### Jonathan Kavanagh, Vice Chair, writes

As one of the three Vice Chairs it's been a noticeable year of contrasts for the group. While obviously limited in the activities, events and meetings that we've been able to engage our members with, many regular users of the woods will have also noticed the huge surge in visitor numbers in the spring and summer last year as we were all encouraged not to travel beyond our local areas.

Many people, having only lived a few miles away, have been discovering and exploring the woods for the very first time. This includes BBC Radio Nottingham's presenter Verity Cowley who posted on Twitter about her new find, calling the woods "an absolute gem" (no arguments from us), with her presenter colleague Allen Clifford also responding to say that it was "easily my favourite place to visit when I lived in Thorneywood" and so it would seem we have some fans on local radio!

### Metal detectors

We've noticed an increase in the use of metal detectors in the woods, accompanied by holes being dug. The Council have confirmed that the use of metal detectors in the wood is illegal and can lead to criminal damage. The Council never licenses the use of metal detectors in the woods. If you see someone using metal detectors or digging in the woods, please report them to the Council using the email address

## Please don't collect firewood from the woods

Since 2008, it has been an offence to gather wood from private land (which the Woods are, being owned by the Council)) without permission. Please do not chop down branches or gather fallen branches. If they are on the ground, then small animals, insects and birds can use them for shelter.

## Work parties in the Woods

A small work party tidied up the bottom of Mile Run and the Keeper's Cottage area last autumn



We submitted a suggested work plan to the Council and asked for their help in tidying up the memorial plantation, Mile Run, Keeper's Cottage, the pond and the allotments. A small group met with Emily Aron, the Council's biodiversity officer who agreed with our plans. We then met with staff from the Parks and Open Spaces Department who have agreed to

cut back Mile Run and Keeper's Cottage for us.
